Summarize Jesus' point in challenging the logic of the scribes.

What is implied in Jesus statement in verse 27?

4. Read Mark 3:28-30. In the context of this passage, what are the scribes doing that puts them at risk of being guilty of an eternal sin?

Can someone do the same thing today? What sin never has forgiveness?

What would you say to someone who is really concerned that they have committed an unforgiveable sin?

5. Read Mark 3:31-35. Why are those who do the will of God the true family members of Jesus? Why is this a big deal?
